NYAIL Treasurer Rick Duskiwicz was invited by the Council Speaker to testify in front of the Sanitation Committee of the NYC Council last month. He, along with other concerned citizens such as Peter Yorgin and George McDonald, spoke in favor of the new anti-sticker legislation that was co-authored by Council Members Brewer and Avella.

It was obvious from the reactions from the members on the committee and the audience members that they were all familiar with this problem.

The bill is expected to pass the committee by next month. It will then be discussed and voted on by the full Council, probably by February or March. Fifteen Council Members have already signed onto the bill. A minimum of 26 votes is necessary for passage.

This bill was part of a package of three bills, all designed to reduce the litter and graffiti we face everyday in NYC.
